be a show commemorating the life of Lawrence of Arabia in Châlus, the city where Richard the Lionheart died. While the city of Châlus is well known for the famous troubadour King who met his end there, not everyone will be aware of the town's connection to the hero of the First World War, T. E. Lawrence.

The man who would come to be known as Lawrence of Arabia was born in Tremadoc, Caernarfonshire, in North Wales on 16th August 1888 and died near Wareham in Dorset on 19th May 1935, but visited Châlus on the day of his twentieth birthday. He is believed to have visited the area to learn more about the heroes of the Third Crusade

Events are taking place to mark the 80th anniversary of his death, including an English market, where visitors are encouraged to come bearing Welsh or other flags from the United Kingdom. Central to the events will be a free bilingual show that will combine theatre and equestrianism. The celebrations are being organised by Christophe EOCHE-DUVAL, director of the Festival Richard the Lionheart, who put The Bugle in touch with Michael Clarke, an English expat who will be playing the part of Lawrence of Arabia
